Sundays and Wednesdays, Auditorium. David Posey (with Rich Mowrer). "Your Better Life Now: A Study of the Book of Hebrews."

Joel Osteen has written a best-seller entitled "Your Best Life Now." Critics say the book is bereft of scripture and man-centered instead of Christ-centered. Whatever; the point is that the only way we can have our "best life now" is to make certain we are "in Christ," completely and for good.

Most Christians know that Hebrews is a great book to study if you're interested in "rightly dividing the word of God" in terms of how the New Testament fulfills the Old Testament. We also are aware that Hebrews trumpets the superiority of Christ and the New Covenant; that is, Christ is "better" than any pretender as a source of salvation and the New Covenant is "better" than the old.

Hebrews is also a very practical book. The people that the writer was addressing were Christians who were growing weak in the faith—they were "drifting"—and the writer calls them back to faith, hope and commitment.

But we don't have to be "drifting" to gain from a study of the book. We can all use exhortation and encouragement and Hebrews majors in these. And the Lord knows, we need more faith—in fact, we cannot please God without it (Heb. 11:6).

If you know Hebrews, you will be able to capably answer questions about the relationship of the Old Testament and New Testament; you'll likely know more about the Old Testament after the study. More importantly, your faith will grow and your grip on hope will become a little more secure.

Sundays, Room 11-12: Dennis Wade. A Study of the Book of Job.

Overall outcome: Participants will increase their wisdom to deal with “the why” and “the how” of human suffering.

Objectives:

- Answer, “How can we reconcile the suffering of faithful people with a good and all-powerful God?”
- Improve our ability to speak with those who are struggling with pain and suffering.
- Understand why God would allow Satan to “touch” Job and his family.
- Deal with antagonistic questions (by atheists, agnostics, etc.) on this subject.

Approach: Time won't allow a verse-by-verse study so we will summarize long discourses and compare them with the rest of God's word on the subject. The book raises more questions than it answers so we will take time to consider participant questions and do our best to answer them.

Wednesdays, Room 11-12: Jeff Herrin. Evidences.

Beginning in January, there will be a Wednesday evening class on evidences in Room 11. The material presented is being incorporated into our high school class curriculum and will be introduced to them in the Spring Quarter. The title for the spring quarter high school curriculum is Evidences: Exploding the Myths that Challenge God's Word.

Although King David was not intimidated by Goliath, even he thought the task of constructing a temple worthy of the Lord was a daunting one (1 Chron. 29:1). Preparing young people for the assaults on their faith from a

secular society is just as grave a responsibility and the consequences are high. Even if their own faith is unwavering, it is still almost certain that people they care about deeply will be swayed by the arguments of the world. I appreciate the opportunity to spend a quarter discussing these issues with an adult class to further sharpen our thinking before presenting the material to our high school students in the Spring.

Since we are only meeting on Wednesdays for the adult class, the material will be compressed and we will move quickly to cover several topics. Lesson topics will include:

- Introduction;
- Serving God with all your mind in a secular society;
- How Einstein and others proved the universe had a beginning;
- Every watch has a watchmaker;
- Darwin's new critics;
- Intelligent design;
- The reliability of the New Testament accounts and the canon;
- The problems with other gospels (Gospel of Thomas, Gospel of Judas, etc)
- Amazing Biblical prophecies
- Archaeology and the Bible
- Summary
